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# Takeuchi Adds Tier 4 Final TB216 Hydraulic Mini Excavator to Line



Takeuchi-US recently introduced the TB216 compact excavator, replacing the TB016. The TB216 features a Yanmar Tier 4 Final engine, producing 15 horsepower for ample power and performance, while delivering excellent fuel economy.

The excavator has an operating weight of 3,900 pounds, and features a retractable undercarriage making it easy to transport and maneuver between gates and in confined areas. The undercarriage has a two-speed planetary travel motor that delivers a maximum 2.6 mph travel speed and comes with an automatic shift down feature for greater drive torque when turning or pushing. The 9-inch-wide track helps provide a low ground pressure of only 4.3 psi for working on sensitive surfaces. For backfilling and cleanup work, the dozer blade is equipped with bolt-on extensions that can be removed to reduce the overall width of the machine to only 38.6" when the tracks are in the retracted position.

The hydraulic system consists of precision, pilot joysticks that deliver smooth, metered control for the operator and has variable displacement pumps that provide excellent cycle times and an impressive 4,250 pounds of bucket breakout force.

His fleet includes nine mini excavators with models including K057, K040, K035, KX121, and U45, plus an RTV900 utility vehicle and a ZD331 zero-turn mower. "They are very productive utility work. Customers include ATT, Verizon, MCI, Sprint, Northeast Ohio Gas, and Horizon Telecommunications. The compact Kubotas are particularly useful in underground work, Covell noted. "In tight places like downtown Columbus, we use them for working in the street, and we can excavate up to 8 feet deep with a K057." With the Kubotas, he said, he has the productivity of a rubber-tired backhoe but can keep the work to one lane. Additionally, his crews can use a one-ton truck to haul the compact machines so he doesn't need to maintain large trucks.

"Kubota mini excavators are fast and strong for their size, and also very smooth," Covell said. "My eleven full-time operators all agree they wouldn't want anything else."

Another benefit of owning Kubotas is strong resale value, Covell said. He generally keeps a machine for four or five years, then sells it and upgrades.
